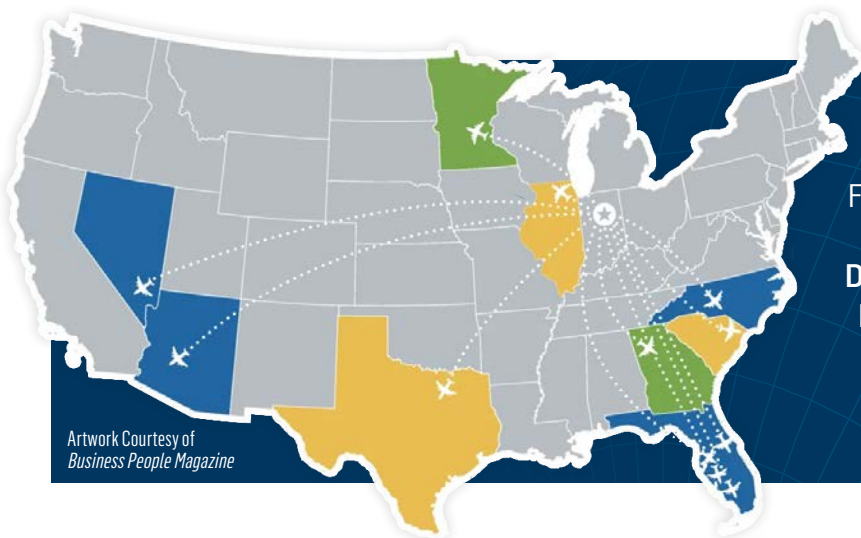

RIVERFRONT FORT WAYNE

📍 BETWEEN EWING & MLK BRIDGES

The transformation has begun, turning the confluence of the St. Marys, St. Joseph, and Maumee rivers into a vibrant regional landmark. With trails, boat excursions, kayaking, playgrounds, and more, Promenade Park (Riverfront Development Phase I) provides a variety of opportunities to explore. Phase II and III include mixed-use development around the Riverfront District.

ELECTRIC WORKS

📍 BROADWAY & SWINNEY AVENUE

One of the largest redevelopment projects in the country, Electric Works is the reinvention of the former General Electric campus, a historic hub of innovation and entrepreneurship. Phase I opened in 2022 featuring the Union Street Market food hall, the new world headquarters for Do it Best Corp., co-working space, an innovation-focused high school, and more. Phase II is well underway with an already-completed parking garage; construction continues on residential and retail space.

STAR FINANCIAL BANK

📍 WEST MAIN STREET & MAIDEN LANE

STAR Financial Bank is establishing a new company headquarters in the downtown Ashberry project—a two-tower, mixed-use building that also includes a 387-space public parking garage, just steps away from other downtown attractions like The Bradley, The Landing, The Pearl, and more.

THE LANDING

📍 COLUMBIA STREET

This investment brings boutique shopping and fine dining to Fort Wayne's original business district. Located just two blocks south of the Riverfront, the redevelopment of this charming street and its architecturally significant buildings includes 70 new downtown apartments.

THE BRADLEY

📍 WEST MAIN STREET & SOUTH HARRISON STREET

A project led by Vera Bradley's co-founder, this five-story, 125-room boutique hotel with restaurants, retail, and rooftop entertainment space brings dynamic new amenities for visitors and residents alike. Located just one block south of The Landing and three blocks south of the Riverfront, guests are treated to the best of downtown.

EAST ALLEN'S RURAL REVIVAL

📍 MULTIPLE LOCATIONS IN EAST ALLEN COUNTY

The momentum is spreading. This package of quality-of-place improvements enhances parks, sidewalks, downtown streetscapes, housing, and more across seven communities in east Allen County.

THE PEARL

📍 WEST MAIN STREET & MAIDEN LANE

Nestled next door to The Bradley, this innovative downtown development features commercial and event space along with more than 70 residences. The project, led by the founder of Sweetwater Sound, adds to the buzz of activity in the nearby Harrison Street Corridor, The Landing, and the Riverfront District.

THE RIVERFRONT AT PROMENADE PARK

📍 WEST SUPERIOR STREET & SOUTH HARRISON STREET

Just across Harrison Street from Promenade Park, this project brings apartments, retail, office space, and parking to the downtown riverfront. The six-story, mixed-use building includes more than 200 apartments, seven townhomes, a 900-space parking garage, and serves as the regional headquarters for Swiss Re, a world leader in the insurance industry.

THE LOFTS AT HEADWATERS PARK


📍 EAST SUPERIOR STREET & SOUTH CLINTON STREET

Overlooking Headwaters Park and the St. Marys River, this six-story, mixed-use project is in the middle of the downtown scene. The building features more than 200 apartments, 15 townhomes, commercial space, and a 650-space parking garage—all with easy access to restaurants, festivals, and the Rivergreenway trail system.

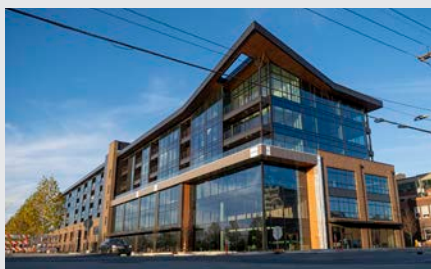


LOOKING AHEAD

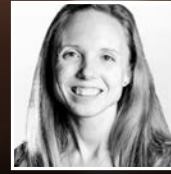
